
JAN JOHNSON

1. The Lord's Supper: A metric of a healthy assembly

- o The Breaking of Bread meeting has been called "the chief meeting of the Church." Worship has been called "the believer's highest occupation."
- o From my earliest days as a believer, I can recall H. G. Mackay saying that the Lord's Supper was the spiritual thermometer of the health of the local assembly. If we believe that to be so, how are we doing?
- o In this session we will go back to basics as we take a fresh look at some of the fundamentals regarding the Lord's Supper – in order to honour His dying request.

2. The Church: Its method

The decline of the church in many parts of the world has prompted some to suggest that we need to go to "Plan B" if we're to survive. This session will consider this all-important topic.

3. Building a New Testament assembly: Its motivation

- ^o God has called us to be labourers together with Him.
- o In this session we ask the question: "Is investing in the local assembly worth the effort?"

Discipleship in the Local Assembly (Jeff Johnson)

A multitude of reasons are cited for why young people are leaving their local churches. Near the top of the list is the complaint that no one is willing to mentor (disciple) them. In this seminar I will share my own experience of being discipled by a man of God, Vernon Schlief. In addition I will discuss my own experience of discipling young men and the accompanying rewards.

Hindrances to Spiritual Growth – our Flesh (Mike Attwood)

We are living in a very self-focused society and, sad to say, this mentality has crept into the local church. The Lord Jesus said that true discipleship is connected with denying self and following Him. This seminar is intended to help us to evaluate (1) where we are at personally in regard to our "flesh" and (2) what is the impact on the assembly when our flesh is on display. We will then discuss how to move to the place where it is "not I but Christ."

In 1 Timothy chapter 2 when Paul speaks of the prayer meeting he says, "Therefore I exhort first of all. . ." What he means is that public prayer in the meetings of the saints is of primary importance. If we want to see spiritual growth, we must recognize our utter dependence upon God for providing the needed blessing. In this seminar we will ask how we can encourage (1) attendance and (2) practical participation in this vital meeting. We will look to the Lord through His Word for the answers.

The Feminine Factor in the New Testament Assembly (Jan Johnson) From the get-go the feminine factor existed and was valued in the establishment and building up of the early church. In this seminar we will explore the Biblical principle of exercise of our spiritual gifts in the local assembly for the edification of the Body. How can we encourage "each member in particular" to get plugged in?

How God Transcends the "Generation Gap" to Bless the Whole Body In the world today it is not uncommon to hear mature adults speaking disparagingly of the generations younger than their own, and younger people speaking dismissively of the irrelevance of the thinking and experience of their elders. What both sides of the generational divide share in common is what the Bible calls the "flesh," self-centered and self-justifying. By contrast, in the New Testament assembly where the Lord Jesus Christ has the preeminent place and Spirit-filled Christians live and work together in spiritually intimate relationship, the generational divide and every other "fleshly" divide break down. In this seminar our conference teachers, Mike and Jeff, will join a panel discussion with a Generation Z believer and one of his assembly elders. Their goal will be realistically to examine the challenge of generational differences in the assembly and to identify Biblical principles that will transform the spiritual landscape for the glory of God. Topics will include intergenerational differences in attitudes, outlook, and areas of strength and weakness; and the joy and blessings of intergenerational harmony as older and younger in a complimentary way share life and responsibilities in the assembly, the local expression of the Body of Christ.


