# A Bible Conference about the Glories of Christ

August 30<sup>th</sup>, 31<sup>st</sup>, and September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 (Labour Day Weekend) Sponsored by Horse Lake Christian Fellowship Located at the Good News Centre in 100 Mile House, B.C.

# Conference Theme

When the Holy Spirit used Luke to write the paragraph on the Lord's dealings with the two disciples on the Emmaus road (Luke 24.13-32), He placed at the very beginning the key information we would need to understand. His opening word, "Behold!" rivets our attention on the two, then He states what we need to know about them. First, they were "of them" - that is, they were part of the group described in verse 9, the group which comprised "the apostles and all the rest," the group to which the women on that same morning had brought their report of an empty tomb and a meeting with angels who reported the resurrection of the Lord Jesus and asked them to remember the words of the Lord Himself who had predicted both His own death and resurrection. But neither they nor the apostles believed the women's message, concluding that it was "like an idle tale." And, secondly, the two disciples of the Emmaus road took the additional step of voting with their feet, not even waiting out the remainder of the day of the Lord's resurrection but then and there walking out of Jerusalem and out of the life they had lived with the band of the disciples of the Lord Jesus. They concluded that, since Jesus was now dead, they would return home and rebuild their shattered lives without their former hope in Him as their Messiah.

Perhaps in some measure we can identify with those two disciples as they walked away. It seemed to them that they had been completely blind-sided by the events of that weekend – the unthinkable had happened and they were completely unprepared for it. Emotionally they were afflicted with a sadness that paralyzed them both in the central core of their heart and in the expression of their face which they could not hide; mentally their thinking was locked in a useless cycle of circular reasoning

which blocked their understanding of either the scriptures or the events of their lives. When the "Stranger" drew near and, having heard them out, gave them His diagnosis, at first it did not make sense: "Unbelief!" The remainder of Luke's paragraph demonstrates the method of the Great Physician as He does His healing work in the hearts of His disciples who amid the traumas of life have lost their way. "And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself" (24.27)1.

The subject of this conference is "the things concerning Himself." Perhaps in the past we have read this story and felt envious of those two disciples who so profoundly benefited from the Lord's dealing with them on that walk to Emmaus. In the end their confusion turned to understanding; their cold, sad hearts were warmed to a fervent heat; and, above all, they recognized the presence of the Lord Himself with them. Now knowing the way they should take, they changed direction and immediately began to be a blessing to others.

Come to this conference praying with us that our blessed God might reveal to us "the things concerning [His blessed Son]" and, use these precious truths to revive our spirits and reinvigorate us for the purposes for which He has called us. And, for our part, let us pray that He might help us to prepare our hearts to remove any impediment which could hinder His Holy Spirit from teaching us (John 14.26) and glorifying His Son in us (John 16.14).

JJ earned a PhD in Theological Studies from Columbia International University (South Carolina). He teaches Bible, theology, and archaeology classes at Emmaus University in Dubuque, Iowa. JJ previously served at Emmaus in roles of Alumni/Emmaus

Ministries Director and Director of Spiritual Life before moving into full-time teaching. He has also taught courses in the Educational Ministries and Inter-Area Studies departments at Emmaus.

JJ has excavated in the land of Israel and serves on the Board of Directors for the Associates for Biblical Research, an archaeological apologetics organization. He also enjoys serving the Lord in an itinerant preaching ministry at numerous camps, conferences, and local churches across the USA. JJ and his wife, Janelle, have two children, Asher and Lillian. They attend Arbor Oaks Bible Chapel in Dubuque, Iowa.

#### The Glory of the Emotions of Christ (JJ Routley)

The world today strongly emphasizes our emotions, perhaps to a fault. God created human beings in His image, and part of that image includes feeling emotions. Yet sin has infiltrated even our ability to feel in a way that is honouring and pleasing to the Lord. This seminar seeks to reorient our understanding of human emotion through examining the life of Christ and His perfect emotions. As we look at how the Savior felt in response to the different circumstances of His life, we can gain encouragement and wisdom for how to handle our emotions well and how to glorify God with our feelings.

# The Amazing Potential of a Small or Very Small Assembly (David Dunlap)

Is a big church more effective than a small church? This is one of the Devil's great lies. God has designed small New Testament churches to be among His most powerful weapons in reaching the world for Christ. Repeatedly God reveals in the Bible that He loves to use small things. He would rather use weakness over strength, humility over pride, brokenness over self-confidence. He used five smooth stones and a shepherd boy to defeat Goliath. A small or very small assembly which is hungry for the things of God is a mighty thing in the hands of God. "Never underestimate what God can do with so-called ordinary people who are led by God to serve Him" (Alexander Strauch. We will examine how a small or very small assembly can make an impact for God.

#### The Glory of Christ in the Life of the Local Church (JJ Routley)

What practical fruits does knowing and meditating on the glory of Christ produce for the life of the local church? More than you might initially think! This seminar will focus on practically applying the conference's emphasis on the glory of Christ to our local churches. We will first note several benefits of being preoccupied with the glory of Christ and then seek to generate ideas for increasing an awareness of the glory of Jesus in our assemblies. Time will be devoted to application through brainstorming and group discussion.

#### The Subtle Dangers of Legalism, part one (David Dunlap)

It has been well said that "legalism destroys." From the early days of the church legalism has thrown Christians off course and burdened them. Legalism has been the cause of the demise of many once vibrant Christians, outreach ministries, and local churches. In the gospels Christ was determined to challenge the legalism of the Pharisees and Jewish leaders. It is important to understand that legalists are not just those with higher standards or more rules than others. Legalism is much more serious and dangerous than that. Legalistic thinking will lead us to measure our standing before God by our feelings and efforts. Legalistic attitudes will cause us to lay heavy burdens upon one another. Legalistic mindsets will lead Christians to believe that by engaging in certain activities, imitating certain behaviours, wearing certain clothes, or reading certain books will raise our position before God without regard to the condition of our heart. This seminar will look at what legalism is, its dangers, its subtle traps, and what are remedies for it.


